Personal Gear -

On all trips -

- Pack or Knapsack
- Sleeping bag
- Sweater or Jac-shirt
- Poncho or Rain suit
- First Aid Kit/Supplies
- Emergency kit
- Extra socks

 - Plate
 - Cup
 - Cooking equipment (see below)
- Toilet kit, containing
 - Soap
 - Washcloth
 - Toothbrush
- Repair Kit, containing
 - Shoelaces

- Toilet (AP) paper
- Flashlight
- Scout Knife / multi-tool
- Canteen
- Nylon twine, rope
- Any Prescription Medicines
- Winter Trips - Add
 - Gloves or mittens
 - Toboggan or warm hat

Optional, convenience items -

Be prepared to add troop equipment to pack, including your portion of tentage and cooking equipment, hand axe, saw, or other patrol/troop items.

Notes - Cooking equipment - This category depends on menu and type of cooking. Backpacking trips require stove and pot, with fuel; possibly other items. Sharing the stove is recommended. Tailgaters might require no personal cooking gear, only troop equipment. When planning a trip, plan the menu, then note all items necessary for the preparation of that menu. Don't plan on pancakes and forget the spatula, or dutch oven without charcoal and lighter.

Clothes - This depends on season and weather report. BEWARE OVERPACKING, if there is any hiking involved.

Do Not Bring - any items from forbidden items list. No electronics, fireworks, non-scout reading materials, etc.
